

KANANA COUNCIL RAPID ASSESSMENT OF ADOLESCENT SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH (ASRHR)



JANUARY 2022

This fact sheet is a summary of the findings of the ASRHR Rapid Assessment undertaken in Kanana as part of an eight-country study from November 2019 to December 2020. The research aims to strengthen youth-led and focused efforts to promote ASRHR through gender and youth responsive local governance. Gender Links Lesotho conducted the study in nine Centers of Excellence for Gender in Local Government.² In Kanana, the study covered just one clinic; 63 respondents: 46% young women and 54% young men (see table overleaf). This fact sheet should be read together with the Lesotho and the Southern Africa ASRHR Rapid Assessment research pamphlets. Key findings include:

Accessibility

- Half of the respondents (54%) reported being within 10 km of a clinic. However, more clinics are needed even if it could be mobile.
- About (70%) of respondents said that the clinic had a comfortable waiting and consultation area.
- The only visited clinic does not charge a fare for services provided.

Quality of care

- About 78% of respondents said they received appropriate information with 49% saying health workers spend sufficient time with them.
- Sixty-two percent of respondents said the clinic treated them with respect while 46% with confidentiality.

- Over 43% of young women had privacy when visiting the clinic.
- About 48% attested to the availability of peer counsellors.
- However only 41% of young people are treated without third party present.

Sexual and reproductive health services

- Forty-Four percent of respondents requested contraceptives and almost 89% received; this shows young women have access to contraceptives.
- In terms of pregnancy test, only 55% requested and 75% received.
- Only 19% of respondents tested positive for pregnancy.
- Over the 43% of young women who requested pads, none of them received them, this is very disturbing as many young women miss school during their period.
- Almost 71% of young men requested male circumcision while only 67% received the appointment.
- Sixty percent of young women requested HIV tests and the whooping 95% received HIV tests, this is very impressive especially now that Lesotho is working tirelessly to make sure that testing sites are accessible.
- Only 8% requested ARVS and 40% received, this is highly worrying to think that ARVS are free in Lesotho and more sensitisation on test and treat is required.
