

## MOKA COUNCIL RAPID ASSESSMENT OF ADOLESCENT SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH (ASRHR)



JANUARY 2022

This fact sheet is a summary of the findings of the ASRHR Rapid Assessment undertaken in Moka as part of an eight-country study<sup>1</sup> from November 2019 to December 2020. The research aims to strengthen youth-led and focused efforts to promote ASRHR through gender and youth responsive local governance. Gender Links Mauritius conducted the study in seven Centers of Excellence for Gender in Local Government.2 In Moka, the study covered 9 community health centres; 271 respondents: 50% young women, 1% gender non-conforming and 49% young men (see table overleaf). This fact sheet should be read together with the Mauritius and the Southern Africa ASRHR Rapid Assessment research pamphlets. Key findings include:

**Accessibility** 

- All respondents reported being within 10 km of a community health centre.
- None of the community health centres are open after school.
- Almost all respondents, except for Providence community health centre with 3% of respondents, said that the facilities are closed during weekends.
- Almost all respondents (95%) said that the Community Health Centres had a comfortable waiting area.

• None of the community health centres charged fees for their services.

## **Quality of care**

- None of the respondents, except for Providence community health centre with 3% of respondents, said that peer counsellors were available across the 9 community health centres.
- Almost all of the young people (99%) said that they were treated with respect and that their privacy and confidentiality was maintained.
- Overall, 85% of the youth were treated without a parent being present, with 7 community health centres recording a 100% positive response.
- The majority (99%) of respondents said that health workers spent sufficient time with them.
- Almost all of the young people affirmed that they did not receive appropriate information overall, except for around 3% of young people from St Julien community health centre.

## Sexual and reproductive health services

• Almost all of the respondents (99%) said that they were referred to a relevant facility.
