

SAVANNE COUNCIL RAPID ASSESSMENT OF ADOLESCENT SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH (ASRHR)



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This fact sheet is a summary of the findings of the ASRHR Rapid Assessment undertaken in Savanne as part of an eight-country study¹ from November 2019 to December 2020. The research aims to strengthen youth-led and focused efforts to promote ASRHR through gender and youth responsive local governance. Gender Links Mauritius conducted the study in seven Centers of Excellence for Gender in Local Government.² In Savanne, the study covered 4 community health centres; 176 respondents: 53% young women, 1% gender non-conforming and 46% young men (see table overleaf). This fact sheet should be read together with the Mauritius and the Southern Africa ASRHR Rapid Assessment research pamphlets. Key findings include:

Accessibility

- The majority of respondents (88%) reported living within 10 km of a community health centre.
- Eighty-three percent of the respondents said that the community health centres are open after school, with a 100% response received for Chamouny community health centre.
- Seventy-three percent of the respondents said that the facilities are closed during weekends.
- Seventy-seven percent of respondents claimed that the community health centre had a comfortable waiting area.
- None of the community health centres charged fees for their services.

Quality of care

- Almost a quarter (24%) of young people affirmed that peer counsellors were available throughout the four community health centres.
- A majority of the young people (84%) said that they were treated with respect and 87% of the respondents said they had that their privacy and confidentiality maintained.
- Only 15% of the youth were treated without a parent being present and low response rates were observed across all 4 community health centres.

- Over two thirds (66%) of respondents said that health workers spent sufficient time with them.
- More than half (58%) of young people affirmed that they received appropriate information overall.

Sexual and reproductive health services

- Only 6% of the respondents requested contraceptives and half of them (50%) received contraceptives upon request. This relatively low percentage of young people requesting contraceptives is a cause for concern as access to contraceptives is key to ensure that ASRH is prioritised.
- Overall, 5% of the young women surveyed requested a pregnancy test. Two fifths (40%) of women received a pregnancy test. It is to be noted that 6% of the women were pregnant during that time period. Access to contraceptives should be improved.
- Forty-seven percent of pregnant young women requested an ante-natal check-up and 50% of the young women received an ante-natal checkup.
- Only 4% of young women YW requested postnatal care and 25% of them received post-natal care.
- Few (4%) of young women requested help with breastfeeding and 50% of them received help with breastfeeding.
- Only 6% of the young women requested for sanitary pads. Over two thirds (67%) of the young women who requested sanitary pads received them, with Grand Bois community health centre receiving a 100% positive response.
- Overall, 4% of the respondents requested an HIV test. Forty-three percent of those who requested an HIV test received it.
- Only 9% of the respondents said health workers asked about their mental health. This is a concern, as ASRHR and mental health are closely linked.
- 46% of the young people said that a follow-up appointment was set up while 49% of young people were thereafter referred to a relevant facility.
